MINUTES

Honorable John Riley moved to approve the minutes from the January 26, 2017 RTC meeting. Honorable Dan Ison seconded. Motion carried unanimously on a voice vote.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

There were no public comments.

COUNTY TRANSPORTATION UPDATES IN THE KIPDA ADD REGION

Shelby County

Judge Ison reported that the main focus and effort is on widening KY-53 between US-60 and I-64. Completing this project was in the funding the last period but the funding was removed from the budget. Some citizens will need to be taken to court in order to get the Right of Way Condemnations. This process has already begun.

Judge Ison reported that District 5 would be paving some roads in 2018. There is \$1.7 million available to fund those resurfacing projects. The 2017-18 budget is being worked on and paving more streets will be a priority. Mayor Hardesty, Judge Ison, Ryan Libke, and Mayor Eden met this morning to discuss the land use maps for Shelby County. Their discussion included possible road connections and how those road connections would affect the area.

Ryan Libke spoke to council members about a public meeting on the Shelby County Comprehensive Plan that will be held on April 26 from 11:00am to 8:00 pm at the Stratton Center in Shelbyville. Mr. Libke also mentioned that City of Simpsonville is getting ready to allow bids for phase three of their sidewalk project along US 60.

KENTUCKIANS FOR BETTER TRANSPORTATION UPDATE

Mr. Embry gave an update on Kentuckians for Better Transportation. The possible \$1 trillion investment in the national infrastructure proposed by the President was discussed. \$2.4 billion in cuts were proposed to federal transportation programs that fund air, rail, and surface transit projects. More information will be available if and when the suggested investment is passed.

HIGHWAY SPONSORSHIP LIST FOR KYTC DISTRICT 5

Mr. Embry reported that local officials meetings were held in each county in February to see what their priorities were for highway projects. KYTC District 5 has 71 sponsored projects throughout Bullitt, Jefferson, Oldham, Henry, Shelby, Trimble, and Spencer Counties. The District 5 sponsored projects have been prioritized based on need. A spreadsheet detailing the District 5 list of 71 sponsored projects was handed out to council members. The projects sponsored by the district office in the KIPDA Area Development District will be submitted to Frankfort for scoring and ranking based on need.

HIGHWAY SPONSORSHIP LIST FOR THE KIPDA ADD

Mr. Embry handed out and discussed the highway sponsorship list for the KIPDA Area Development District. The list includes 21 possible projects to sponsor separately. These projects were divided amongst the counties. Five projects went to Henry County, five went to Trimble County, five went to Spencer, and six were given to Shelby County since it is the largest county in the area development district region.

Judge Ison motioned to approve the 21 highway sponsorship list for the KIPDA Area Development District. Mayor Hardesty seconded. Motion carried unanimously on a voice vote.
