Oldham County has requested a change in the topic of the planning study approved in the *FY 2009 Unified Planning Work Program* (UPWP). They are proposing to revise the scope of work from a Buckner Area Transportation Study to an update of the 2003 Oldham County Major Thoroughfare Plan to incorporate the "Practical Solutions" philosophy of the

Shelby Kentucky Transportation Cabinet.

A revised application form for the proposed Oldham County Major Thoroughfare Plan update is attached for your review and consideration. The total cost (\$70,000) and split

between FY 2009 and FY 2010 UPWP funding is unchanged.

Action is requested to approve this amendment to the *FY 2009 Unified Planning Work Program*.

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FUNDING APPLICATION FOR SHORT RANGE PLANNING STUDY

This form is to be completed by agencies seeking KIPDA MPO planning funds to conduct short range planning studies as part of the annual Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). The purpose of the form is to provide pertinent information to KIPDA staff, the Transportation Technical Coordinating Committee, and the Transportation Policy Committee for consideration in developing the UPWP. Please provide all information.

Describe the purpose of the short range study.

Oldham County prepared and adopted the Oldham County Major Thoroughfare Plan in 2003. Oldham County wishes to update the plan to incorporate the "Practical Solutions" philosophy proposed by the Transportation Cabinet. The Plan update will focus on three major areas:

- 1. Update the Functional Classification Map and expand the map to include recommendations for future local road corridors.. By adopting a corridor map and consistently applying it in the development review process, Oldham County can ensure that future roads and transportation facilities will connect with existing roads and transportation facilities.
- 2. Recommend top priority safety projects or 'spot improvements" that may or may not be within the scope of major road improvement projects; and
- 3. Develop an access management regulation that supports the updated functional classification map.

It is anticipated that item number one (1) will be developed with the first phase of this project's funds and item numbers two (2) and three will be developed with the second phase of this project's funds. Matching funds will be in the form of Oldham County staff time.

What geographic area is to be covered by the study?

Countywide

What is the total estimated cost to conduct the study and how much is being requested from KIPDA?

\$56,000 (80%) Being requested from KIPDA

\$14,000 (20%) Oldham County Fiscal Court (combination of cash and staff in-kind donation)

\$70,000 Total estimated cost to conduct the study

What are the anticipated start and completion dates for the study?

Anticipated start time(Phase I): February 1, 2009. Anticipated completion date: June 30, 2009. Anticipated start time (Phase II): July 1, 2009. Anticipated completion date: December 31, 2009

Will the study be conducted by agency staff or use consultant services?

A consulting firm will be selected to conduct the Study. Oldham County Planning and Zoning staff will participate in some of the tasks.

applications. SITAG members determined priority of projects based on the criteria that INDOT uses to evaluate applications: coordination, project need, and fiscal and

managerial capability. The attached list reflects their recommendation and the

recommendation of the Transportation Technical Coordinating Committee (made at

the January 2009 TTCC meeting).

In order to consider these requests, the Indiana Department of Transportation requires TPC certification that any awarded projects will go through the TIP

amendment process.

KIPDA staff is in the process of preparing the draft FY 2010 Unified Planning Work Program. As part of that effort, applications for funding to conduct transportation planning

studies in the year starting July 1, 2009 are being sought from member governments. Each year the Transportation Policy Committee (TPC) adopts a Work Program that may accommodate as many eligible planning studies as the budget permits. Examples of such

studies include access management, scoping, bicycle/pedestrian, parking, thoroughfare plans, and transit, at the regional, county, city, subarea, or corridor level. Many of the

A request for these studies was sent to committee members in December along with the application form. The applications are due to KIPDA by Friday, January 30, 2009.

The coming year will present the usual circumstances, with one additional consideration:

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- 1. We do not know the amount of planning funds that will be available to KIPDA for FY 2010;
- 2. While KIPDA has sometimes provided the 20% non-federal match for the planning funds used by local governments, it is uncertain whether KIPDA will have enough funds available to do so, of if the 20% will need to be the responsibility of the applicant local government;
- 3. If the requests exceed the available budget, the TPC will determine which studies are to be funded through adoption of the final Work Program; and
- 4. Due to the number and amount of last year's applications, the TPC split funding for five studies over FY 2009 and FY 2010 by committing \$178,000 of the FY 2010 federal funding to studies started this fiscal year.
