SUBJECT: Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside Program

The Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside (TA Set-Aside) Program was authorized under Section 1109 of the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act, which is the current Federal transportation funding and authorization bill. The new TA Set-Aside Program provides funding for projects defined as transportation alternatives, and retains many elements of the former Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP), Transportation Enhancement (TE) Program, and

Safe Routes to School (SRTS) Program.

With the establishment of the new TA Set-Aside Program, the Transportation Policy Committee will be asked to approve proposed changes to previously approved application materials and selection criteria, and may consider taking action on two programmatic changes. Subsequent to Transportation Policy Committee (TPC) approval, KIDPA staff will issue a Notice of Funding Availability for dedicated TA Set-Aside Program funds.

The first programmatic change to consider is in regards to the amount of funding available for the TA Set-Aside Program. The FAST Act allows the MPO to reallocate up to 50% of the annual sub-allocated amount of TA Set-Aside Program funds for more traditional Surface Transportation Program (STP) projects.

The second programmatic consideration is in regards to project eligibility. The FAST Act provides the MPO with discretion as to the types of projects that are eligible for TA Set-Aside Program funds. The MPO cannot expand the eligible project categories, but can restrict them. For a list of project eligibility, see Page 4 of the draft TA Set Aside Program Application Guide.

On February 13th, the Transportation Technical Coordinating Committee (TTCC) recommended revisions to the proposed selection criteria changes, and then approved the application materials pending inclusion of the selection criteria revisions. The TTCC decided not to recommend either of the two optional programmatic changes.
