TPC Chair J. Byron Chapman called the meeting to order at 1:04 p.m. After introductions were made, it was determined that there was a quorum present.

Review and Approval of Minutes

Tonya Higdon, Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC), made a motion to approve the minutes of the October 11 TTCC meeting. Keith Griffee, Bullitt County, seconded the motion and it carried with a unanimous vote.

Bernie Bowling, City of St. Matthews, made a motion to approve the minutes of the November 21 TPC meeting. Keith Griffee, Bullitt County, seconded the motion and it carried with a unanimous vote.

Public Meeting Report

Ashley Tinius, KIPDA staff, reported on public involvement activities.

Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) Funds

As required by MAP-21 and continued with the FAST Act, MPOs are required to take a more Shelby formalized performance-based approach to planning. FHWA requires MPOs to address several

performance measures including: Safety, Asset Management, and System Performance and Congestion. FTA requires MPOs and transit providers to conduct performance management as well. The first of FHWA's prescribed performance measures (PM 1) requires MPOs to address

Safety, and to do so more specifically through the following five (5) measures:

Indiana Member Counties

- Number of Fatalities
- Fatality Rate
- Number of Serious Injuries
- Serious Injury Rate

Number of Non-Motorized Fatalities and Serious Injuries

A critical element of the performance management process is the setting of performance "targets". The deadline for MPOs to set their initial targets for PM 1 is February 27, 2018. By this date, MPOs must have established a baseline condition for all five (5) safety performance measures using a five-year rolling average for the data from 2012-2016. Also by this date, MPOs must report their targets to their state DOTs. The proposed targets are based on the five-year rolling average from 2014-2018. The presentation at the TPC meeting will focus on PM 1 Safety Performance Measures, the baseline conditions, the proposed targets, and KIPDA staff's methodology in establishing these targets.

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> In addition to the federally-mandated measures, KIPDA has developed its own performance measures which are included in KIPDA's Performance Management Plan (adopted by TPC in August 2015). At the time of adoption, no Final Rules had yet been determined for



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the federally-mandated measures. Since that time, the Final Rules for each federal performance measure have been released and we are approaching the deadlines to set targets for every performance measure. KIPDA staff will modify the *Performance Management Plan* to reflect both the federal performance measures and our targets once they are approved by the TPC, assuring our compliance with the FAST Act.

The following are KIPDA's proposed PM 1 Safety Performance Targets:

PM 1: Safety Targets	KIPDA MPO
Number of Fatalities	131.4
Fatality Rate (per 100 million VMT)	1.17
Number of Serious Injuries	859.4
Serious Injury Rate (per 100 million VMT)	7.66
Number of Non-Motorized Fatalities and Serious Injuries	110.1

At their February 14 meeting, the Transportation Technical Coordinating Committee (TTCC) recommended TPC approval of the targets as presented herein. The TPC will be asked for approval of the targets, for permission to amend the KIPDA Performance Management Plan to incorporate them into the document, and for a Resolution which will be sent to both states and to FHWA documenting the selected targets.

- Correcting obvious minor data entry errors.
- Splitting or combining projects without modifying the original project intent.
- Changing or clarifying elements of a project description (with no change in funding). This change would not alter the original project intent.
- Moving a project from one funding category to another.
- Shifting the schedule of a project or phase within the years covered by the STIP/TIP (with no impact to fiscal constraint).
- Adding Planning, Design, ROW or Utilities "phases" to a construction project that is already included in the STIP.
- Moving any identified project phase programmed for previous year into a new TIP (rollover provision).
- Updating project cost estimates (within the original project scope and intent) that do not impact fiscal constraint.
- Adding projects that are considered "grouped projects" that do not require public review, redemonstration of fiscal constraint, or a conformity determination.

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The changes to the FY 2018 – 2021 TIP are included on the attached tables and are being presented to you for your information only. These changes do not affect the fiscal constraint of the Transportation Improvement Program, nor will they affect the progress of other projects in the program.
