CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Rose called the meeting to order at 1:31 p.m.

ROLL CALL

Ms. Miller called roll. There was a quorum.

MINUTES FROM APRIL 9, 2024

Mr. Fleming moved to approve the minutes from the April 9, 2024 Regional Water Management Council Meeting with one correction. Mr. Bates seconded. Motion carried unanimously on a voice vote.

KY WWATERS PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Ms. Landrum stated that the Kentucky Water and Wastewater Assistance for Troubled or Economically Restrained Systems (KY WWATERS) program has funding available. The Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) accepts and reviews applications and performs credit analysis. The Kentucky General Assembly decides who will receive loan funding during the 2025 Legislative Session and KIA will administer the funding after

the Session is ended in March 2025. There is \$75 million in funds available in 2025 and \$75 million available in 2026, for a total of \$150 million.

The KY WWATERS program timeline is as follows:

- Applications will be accepted June 1 August 15, 2024
- Projects will be taken to the KIA Board for scoring on August 1, September 5, and October 3, 2024
- Project applications and scores will be provided to the General Assembly on December 1, 2024
- The General Assembly will select projects to receive funding from January 2025 – March 2025
- KIA will contact the approved applicants in April 2025

In order to be eligible for this funding, applicants must meet at least one of the following criteria:

- Service area median household income (MHI) must be less than the state MHI
- User rate affordability must be greater than 1% of annual MHI
- No audit in at least one of the prior three years
- Negative income in any two of the previous five years
- Debt service coverage ratio of less than 1:1 in any three of the previous five years
- Accounts payable turnover ratio of less than one
- Days sales in accounts receivable ratio of greater than 45 days
- Notice of violation or agreed order in the past year
- Water loss percentage greater than 30%

The following types of projects are eligible for KY WWATERS funding:

- Capital construction projects
- Development of technical, operational, and maintenance resources and expertise
- Improvement of utility infrastructure planning, repair, maintenance, renovation, and management of plants and assets
- Procurement of technical expertise in areas of rate-setting, cost-ofservice, and proper utility accounting standards for the utility type
- Performance and correction of deficiencies from drinking water, wastewater, and financial audits

- Correction of financial inadequacies, including debt service coverage through relief or refinance of debt
- Assistance with payment for excessive maintenance costs, fines, and penalties from past violations or consultants
- Correction of inadequately maintained distribution, collection, or treatment works, including service extensions to unserved or underserved areas and the renovation of treatment works to conserve resources

The interest rates for KY WWATERS program loans are:

• Standard rate: 1.75%

Non-standard (a) rate: 0.75%Non-standard (b) rate: 0.00%

Water and wastewater systems interested in applying for KY WWATERS funding should contact Mr. Carter, Senior Regional Planner at KIPDA to begin the application process.

NEW WATER AND WASTEWATER PROJECTS TO APPROVE

WX21029307 – Shepherdsville Rd. Water Main Extension

- Applicant: Louisville Water Company
- Estimated Total Project Cost: \$2,295,772
- This project includes the installation of 7,300 linear feet (LF) of 8" PVC water main along Shepherdsville Rd. in Bullitt County
- This project will extend water service to an unserved portion of Bullitt County
- The Louisville Water Company provides retail service to a portion of Bullitt County. Some areas in the Louisville Water Company's Bullitt County retail service area are underserved or do not have water service available. This project will make service available along this segment of Shepherdsville Rd. in Bullitt County.

WX21029307 - Moore Lane Water Main Extension

Applicant: Louisville Water CompanyEstimated Total Project Cost: \$519,580

- This project includes the installation of 1,700 linear feet (LF) of 6" PVC water main along Moore Lane in Bullitt County. This project will extend water service to an unserved portion of Bullitt County.
- The Louisville Water Company provides retail service to a portion of Bullitt County. Some areas in the Louisville Water Company's Bullitt County retail service area are underserved or do not have water service available. This project will make service available along this segment of Shepherdsville Rd. in Bullitt County.

WX21029039 – Cave Springs Drive Water Main Extension

- Applicant: Louisville Water Company
- Estimated Total Project Cost: \$277,170
- This project includes the installation of 800 linear feet (LF) of 6" PVC water main along Cave Springs Drive in Bullitt County. This project will extend water service to an unserved portion of Bullitt County.
- The Louisville Water Company provides retail service to a portion of Bullitt County. Some areas in the Louisville Water Company's Bullitt County retail service area are underserved or do not have water service available. This project will make service available along this segment of Shepherdsville Rd. in Bullitt County.

SX21215007 - Spencer County Sanitation District WWTP

- Applicant: Spencer County Fiscal Court
- Estimated Total Project Cost: \$5,572,500
- This project will construct a new 0.25 MGD wastewater treatment plant (WWTP) in Spencer County, KY.
- There is no existing WWTP operated by the Spencer County Sanitation District in Spencer County.

Mr. Raney moved to approve the above wastewater project. Mr. Bates seconded. Motion carried unanimously on a voice vote.

WATER MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR'S REPORT

Mr. Carter stated that the State Revolving Fund (SRF) season will soon be here, and the FY2025 SRF call for projects will open in early September. Mr. Carter will be reaching out in the next few weeks to begin scheduling the FY2025 County Water Management Council meetings in all the Kentucky KIPDA counties. These meetings will include discussions on water, wastewater, and stormwater priorities for each county for FY2025 and will prioritize and rank each project.
